



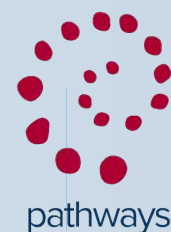

# RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Religious Education at Monivae College aims to prepare students to be lifelong learners and global citizens in a pluralist society where multiple worldviews co-exist.
